

Answer to the Bird Quiz: Mourning Dove:

Medium-sized dove with gray-brown upperparts and pink-brown underparts. Eyes are dark with a small, black spot beneath. Bill is dark. Wings are

gray-brown with black spots. Tail is long and pointed with black-edged white tips on outer feathers.
